Join St Lazarus for an evening of discovery, as they explore the history of friendship between Australia and Serbia, formed in colonial times, evolving as Australia's colonies achieved nationhood at Federation, and immortalized through alliance on the battlefields of World War I. Uncover the stories of the people who served as honorary consuls of Serbia, mingling with the high society of the colonial (and later state) capitals, as well as some of the Australians who served as medical volunteers with the Serbian Army during World War I, through photographs, newspaper archives, early motion pictures and important documents, including the Treaty of Friendship and Commerce with Serbia from 1880.

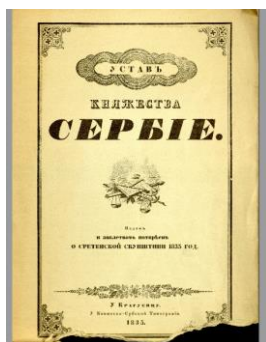

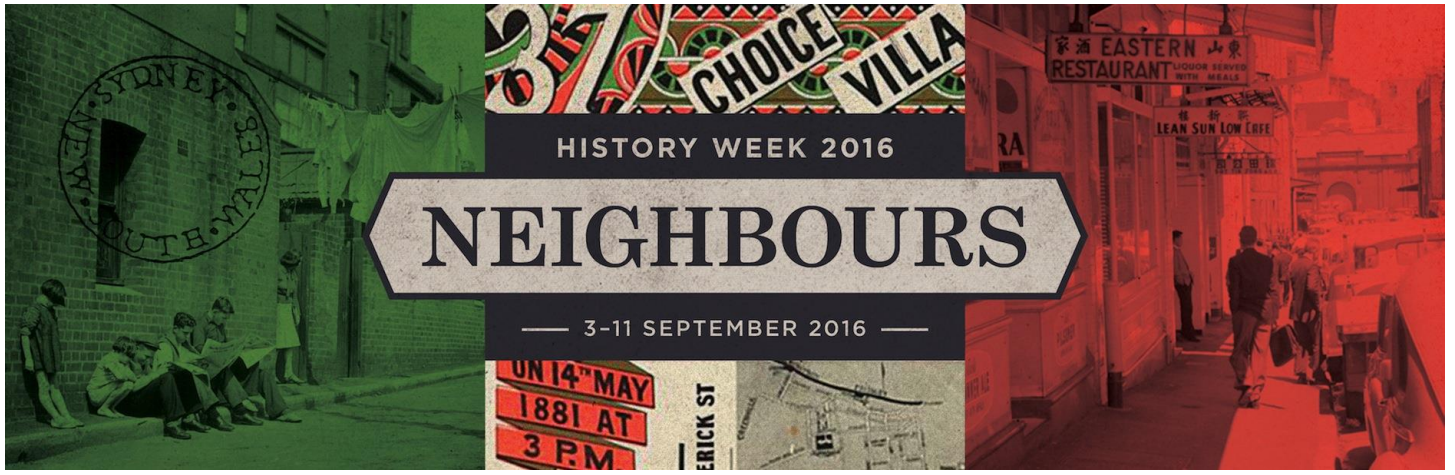
